He received one of our backpacks. The kids left him and ordered a pizza and got him some shoes and socks and they went back to take those items. The man was eating the food we provided in the backpack and was very appreciative of everything. He had two Christmas ornaments that were apparently handmade and he insisted on giving those ornaments to Wendy. What a kind gesture from someone who has so little. Chris was not sure if this guy had made the ornaments or if someone had given them to him. This certainly touched my heart.
